
Dear Schools and partners,

campaigning to provide sufficient vaccine resources for all eligible children at no cost. Vaccines that are recommended include, but not limited to, COVID-19, Tdap, MCV and HPV. - Patients in California have rights. They can contact their managed care plans (including Medi-Cal managed care) to ask for assistance in accessing immunization services within 10 business days.

Measle Outbreak and Vaccine Safety

Measles is a highly contagious viral disease. It is widespread in many parts of the world, including Europe, Africa, and Asia. Measles begins with a fever that lasts for a couple of days, followed by a cough, runny nose, conjunctivitis (pink eye), and a rash. The rash typically appears first on the face, along the hairline, and behind the ears and then affects the rest of the body. Infected people are usually contagious from about 4 days before their rash starts to 4 days afterwards. As of February 7, 2024, 2 confirmed measles cases have been reported in California.

Does the MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) Vaccine cause autism? There is no scientific evidence that the MMR vaccine causes autism. The question about a possible link between the vaccine and autism has been extensively reviewed by independent groups of experts in the United States, including the Health Division of the National Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine. These reviews have concluded that there is not a causal link between the MMR vaccine and autism. History of Measles | CDC
