
Dear Providers and Partners,

### World Polio Day

World Polio Day highlights the global efforts to end poliomyelitis (polio) world-wide. Polio is a life threatening disease caused by the poliovirus, which the World Health Assembly committed to eradicate in 1988. The WHO European Region was declared polio-free in 2002 and has sustained this status every year since then.

Every year on October 24th, we observe World Polio Day to raise awareness of the importance of polio vaccination to protect every child from this devastating disease, and to celebrate many parents, professionals and volunteers who contributions make polio eradication achievable.



To ensure a polio-free future for everyone, efforts must continue to maintain high immunization coverage, implement high-quality surveillance to detect any presence of the virus, and prepare to respond in the event of an outbreak.
